¹³ 635 Claim of D. Baldwin against Puhaina or Wahine's ^{Father} title

Neither of these Claims are on records. Testimony taken by
 the President - without date - in the month of May.

Puhaina Claims the title of Kuleanu in Pualea
 Kaupo. and D. Baldwin Claims a small patch in it
 as an orange Grove.

Wahine sw. I know the Orange patch of D. Baldwin
 in the title of Kuleanu - Ahupuaa of Pualea - Kaupo.
 it contains 3 Orange trees - its side is indefinite. I
 cannot give boundaries - the trees are somewhat apart.
 My Father Wahine planted these and many other
 trees on spot for D. Baldwin about 1835 - when
 Maunaloa lived. D. Baldwin gave the seed to my
 father, who planted them for D. Baldwin - who has
 always owned the fruit - his title to this land has
 never been disputed. I now take care of the trees
 for D. Baldwin - many of them died.

Kahuahinehine admitted that the testimony given in
 Kapahi's Claim 24 Sep. 1848 was true & therefore the board
 decided against hearing further evidence as that evidence
 and Kahuahinehine's admission settled the claim
 in favor of Kapahi to the small corner he asked for.
