The matter came on for hearing at Police Court Honolulu on Wednesday June 16<sup>th</sup> 1886.

Present

Mr Whiting, J. J. Brown, S. M. Damon and others - Wm Wond interpreter.

J. J. Brown Sworn States.

I know the land of Kapalama and know the boundaries, this map represents the Ahupua'a of Kapalama. I surveyed Mokauea, joining this land, I surveyed the whole line between Kalihii & Kapalama - the boundary makai of the Gov't road is settled by L. C. A. 6450. Above the road for about half a mile, boundary joins L. C. Awards and Grants in Kalihii, which is shown in Government Map of Kalihii made by myself; that line is indicated on the map of Kapalama, from Mokauea Station to the head of Kapalama the boundary follows a sharp well known natural boundary

or ridge the whole distance, from head down to head of Alewa, I do not know the boundary, but there is a ridge all the way down, the boundary along Alewa, is shown in old survey of Makalea - on behalf of Hawaiian Government I approve the boundary as indicated on this map - below Alewa on Honolulu side between Alewa and the sea line the boundary is substantially as given in old survey by A. Bishop and is almost entirely along Kuleana's - I am not positive of any Ili's, but Bishop's old survey shows a small piece at Kavili apart from main land, the fishery is indicated on the old map joining Kapalama & loko of Ananoho. The Ili of Kalakohako is in Kapalama. I based my survey principally on old surveys & grants and Kuleana's, the natives generally stated the boundary in upper portion to be correct. There are a great many Kuleana's in Kapalama, and on the Honolulu side assisted me in locating the boundaries, from Mokanea station to head of <sup>the land</sup> land, adjoining is claimed by the Government, Loko Kawili belongs to Government. The stream above & below Government road, I consider the middle of stream the boundary. I surveyed Kapo and understood it belonged to Kelikalani Est. S. Bishop sworn states.

These notes of survey, are mine derived from map by J. S. Brown, part my own survey, and correspond with this map, including "Kapo", on Kalihii side I took my survey from maps of J. S. Brown, I only visited the Honolulu side & on other side there is a sharp ridge and natural boundary the lower part of boundary follows along Kuleana -

The survey notes of fishery were taken from Brown's Map & A. Bishop's map, it is carefully defined on Bishop's map, made a little after 1850 - the fish pond is also defined as lele of Kapalama in same map, the notes of survey of Kapo were taken from J. S. Brown's map, Kauai (w) sworn states.

I was born before building of fort in Lahaina, I live at Kalihio & I have for a long time, I know land at Kapo, it is a lele of Kapalama it is well known, I formerly was Konohiki, Naohia & Pohakuawawaa join Kapo, and the Pali on other side.

Kelikuloa sworn states.

I live at Kalihio for 30 years I know lands mauka at Kapalama the mauka land in Kapo, it is a lele of Kapalama, the old residents of the place have always told me so, Luaitiki Kefu-ohiohi told me, they are dead, Kapua also told me, he was a Kamaaina also the others, Kuanaoa was the owner in old times.

There being no objection and no one contesting the survey, a certificate will issue as per notes of survey filed with petition

## Judgment.

An application to decide and certify the boundaries of the lands of Kapalama & Iliama of Kapo District of Kona Island of Oahu having been filed with me on the 26<sup>th</sup> day of May 1886 by C. R. Bishop & S. M. Damon in accordance with the provisions of an Act to facilitate the settlement of Boundaries, &c, approved on the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of June, A.D. 1868; now, therefore, having duly received and heard all the testimony offered in reference to the said boundaries and having endeavored otherwise to obtain all information possible to enable me to arrive at a just decision, which will more fully appear by reference to the records of this matter by me kept in Book No. 2 page 180, and it appearing to my satisfaction that the true, lawful and equitable boundaries are as follows, viz:
