

**ROYAL PATENT**

## Upon Confirmation of the Land Commission.

Whereas, The Board of Commissioners to quiet Land Titles have by their decision awarded unto

Kaleimoku — Land Commission Award No 6239 —

an estate of FREEHOLD less than Allodial, in and to the Land hereafter described, and whereas

proper application having been made to the Minister of the Interior by Cecil Brown, Attorney for James Campbell and Kapiolani the present owners of the Ahupuaa of Nuu, in the District of Kaupā, Island of Maui, for a Patent of the herein described land, a Certificate of Boundaries defining the same having been duly filed. And whereas the Government Commutation thereon was relinquished by resolution of the Privy Council adopted March 10<sup>th</sup> 1857.

Therefore, Liliuokalani, <sup>The Government of the Republic of Hawaii</sup> ~~By the Grace of God Queen of the Hawaiian~~ Islands, by this ROYAL PATENT, makes known to all men, that ~~she~~ she has for herself, and her successors in office, this day granted and given absolutely, in Fee Simple, unto

all that certain piece of land situate at Nuu in the District of Kaupā in the Island of Maui and described as follows:

- Commencing at a stone marked with a cross at the sea beach, from which stone the Government Survey Station Talakea bears N. 50° 14' E. true; Station N bears S 88° 3' W. true and running:
1. N. 31° 21' E. true 249.5 feet along Nakula to a stone marked thus → on lower edge of Government road, at a place called Huakini.
  2. N. 9° 7' 10" . 9804 ft along Nakula to a cross on a stone 150 ft East of five kukui trees at a place called Alanui Ohua.
  3. N. 12° 32' 10" . 17251 ft along Nakula to a stone marked thus → under a pile of stones on the South rim of Hakukala Crater at a place called Kumuiliaki.
  4. N. 18° 21' 6" . 7600 ft along Ialoai to a pile of stones in the bottom of the crater at a place called Keatmakakolo 325 ft North of a pit called Kaluaoumi.
  5. N. 72° 5' 6" . 6110 ft along Ialoai to a pile of stones on a spur south of Hanakauahi; Thence.
  6. S. 85° 21' 6" . 11358 ft along Ialoai passing near a cave and spring called Lue to a pile of stones 12 ft South East of a cross cut on a stone on a spur South West of Iohakuokiaina, near a large crater called Kaluanui; Thence.

7. S. 0° 44' E. true 6313 ft along Lolo, Grant 3602 to W. Mutch, passing near Waipani to a large rock (at the Kaupo trail) marked with a cross, and called Pohakuloa.
8. S. 7° 7' E . 1808 ft along Lolo, Gr 3602 to W. Mutch; to a large rock marked with a cross near some Lehua trees and called Keolepetye.
9. S. 0° 26' E . 8387 feet along Kaho and Kou, Grant 3602 to W. Mutch to a cross on a stone at a place called Kauhakamoa.
10. S. 27° 44' W . 17923 feet along Kou and Tuumaneoneo, Gr 3157 to A. V. Marciel, Grant 2816 to A. A. Cox, Grant 3160 to W. Mutch, to a large pile of stones on a rocky knoll.
11. S. 47° 46' W . 715 feet along Tuumaneoneo, Grant 3157 to A. Sylva, to the Northwest corner of Grant 1985 to Mahi.
12. S. 41° 52' 10 . 215 feet along Grant 1985.
13. S. 34° 56' W . 216.5 . . . 1985.
14. S. 12° 16' W . 112 . . . 1985.
15. S. 2° 51' E . 268 . . . 1985.
16. S. 19° 15' E . 350 . . . Tuumaneoneo, Gr 3157 to A. Sylva, to sharp stone marked with a cross.
17. S. 3° 3' W . 722 ft along Tuumaneoneo, Gr 3157 to A. Sylva to a stone marked thus → on the upper side of the Government Road;
18. S. 19° 28' 10 . 170 feet along Tuumaneoneo Gr 3157.
19. N. 44° 5' W . 244 . . . , to a cross on a stone at edge of bluff at a place called Nunkalawa.
20. S. 24° 45' W . 565 ft along Tuumaneoneo to the North corner of Gr 2168 Apr 1 to Kehakunaaiole at lower edge of old road.
21. S. 17° 11' W . 1125 ft along Gr 2168 to a stone marked thus → at a place called Kalokoiki, from which stone the Government Survey Station Tuumaneoneo bears N. 49° 35' S. true Kalaeokailio S 85° 12' E. true and Palakea N. 14° 56' W. true 5285 feet;
22. S. 4° 48' E . 300 ft along Gr 2168 to sea at an old canoe harbor; Thence along the sea shore to initial point. The bearing from last point at canoe harbor to initial point being N. 66° 52' W true 5650 feet.

To Have and to Hold the above granted Land in FEE SIMPLE, unto the said

Kaleimoku

Heirs and Assigns forever, subject to the taxes to be from time to time imposed by the Legisla-  
 tive Council, equally upon all landed Property held in Fee Simple.
